The Kalichstein-Laredo-Robinson Trio joins with frequent collaborator, composer/violist Nokuthula Ngwenyama, for premiere performances of her new work "ELEGY" (working title), a 10' work for piano, violin, viola and cello, and is the Trio's response to the tragic events of Spring 2020, including the killing of George Floyd.

In addition to the new work, the program will feature a Trio and a piano quartet (Brahms, Dvorak or Schumann).

Ms Ngwenyama writes "music of bold, mesmerizing character". Her captivating works have been performed around the nation, including a recent premiere with the Detroit Symphony.. She is a winner of the Primrose competition, the Young Concert Artists International Auditions, and an Avery Fisher Career Grant.

Driven by decades-long commitment to premiering and touring new works, the Trio plans to bringing this work to as many places as they possibly can and to make this goal a reality, they are offering this opportunity to multiple partners and hope to keep the commissioning costs below \$2000 each.

The World Premiere is planned for April 2022, with Linton Chamber Music in Cincinnati. Additional commissioning partners (many in 22-23 season) include: Arizona Friends of Chamber Music, Chamber Music Northwest(OR), Hudson Valley Chamber Music Circle, Kennedy Center, Lake Champlain Music Festival (VT), Philadelphia Chamber Music Society, Phoenix Chamber Music Society (AZ) with support from the International Arts Foundation.
